ABOUT THE JOB

Psychiatry in Central Denmark Region consists of 8 psychiatric departments that together they constitute one hospital. Each department has its own management team on the premises, and the hospital management works in unison with the administration units in the city of Viborg.

The vacant specialist positions are located in the cities of Herning, Horsens and Randers.

THE HOSPITAL OFFERS:

- Intensive language course in Denmark, while the doctor receives the full salary. During the course you will gradually increase contact with the department.
- Training on the Danish healthcare system and legislation.
- Thorough introduction to the department, hospital, language, and culture.
- An ambitious professional environment and great colleagues, who look forward to welcoming you.
- Ongoing supervision and guidance in professional, cultural and social issues.
- Guidance in connection with moving abroad, housing search, child care and networking.
- Guidance regarding job search and networking for your spouse.

Main responsibilities and expectations

- Psychiatry works in partnership with many other specialties in regards to the individual patient in order to ensure the best possible treatment, even after the patient has been discharged.
- Taking active responsibility for examination, diagnosis and treatment of psychiatric patients.
- Being involved in the department and contribute positively to the continued development of a good working environment, for the benefit of the patients and their treatment.
- You will be working in partnership with nurses, psychologists and health and social care assistants.
- The hospital treats all patient groups within Psychiatry and Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, in total there are 190,000 bed days and 247,000 outpatient visits a year.
- There is around 3200 members of staff employed.

What's expected of you

- Experience and/or interest in the fields of quality development and research.
- A broad psychiatric education, with comprehensive treatment competencies in psychological, biological and social-psychiatric treatment methods.
- Experience with teaching and guidance of younger colleagues.

Salary and Conditions
